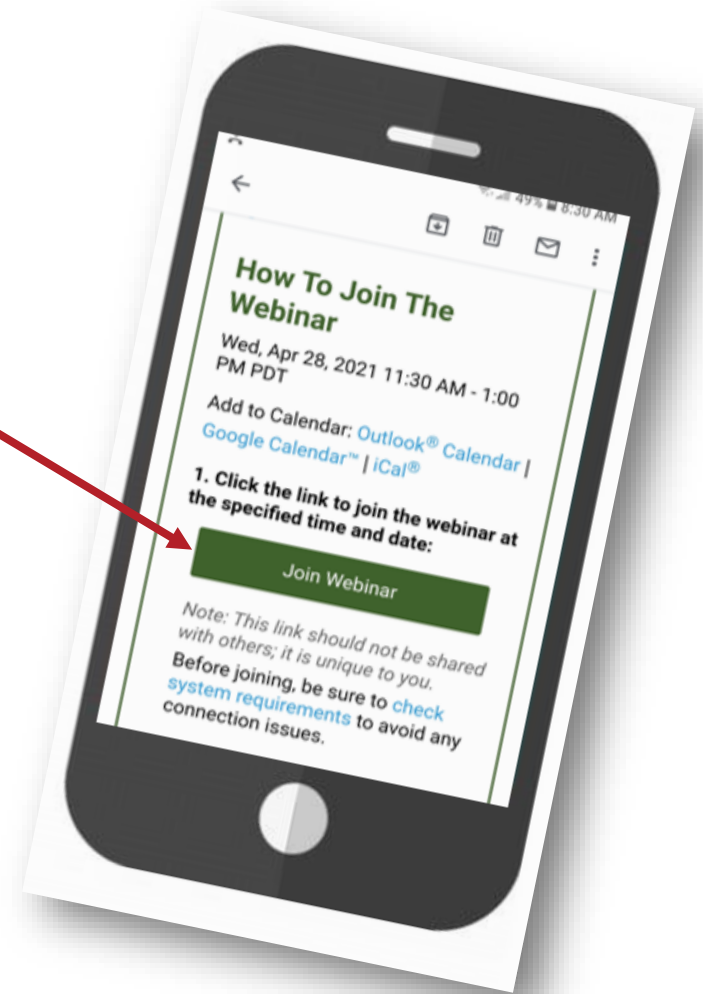

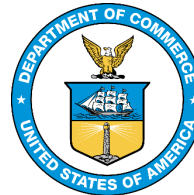

# Grant Application Process

## Pre-Application Activities

- Verify SAM.gov registration
- Obtain Grants.gov workspace access
- Gather all requirements listed in the NOFO to include programmatic documentation and standard forms

## Submit Full Application in Grants.gov

- Applications must be complete and not missing documents
- Applications are due no later than September 1, 2021, 11:59 PDT
- Applications may be submitted through grants.gov, email, or through the mail

## NTIA will review applications in accordance with the NOFO

- Eligibility Review
- Merit Review
- Programmatic Review
- NTIA will reach out to applicants with questions on the application, as appropriate

# Application Timelines

## Application Window:

**90 days: June 3, 2021 through September 1, 2021**

## Application Deadline Key Dates:

- **Applications submitted through Grants.gov:** Must be received no later than 11:59 p.m. Pacific Daylight Time (PDT) on September 1, 2021.
- **Applications submitted by postal mail or by courier service:** Must be postmarked (for postal mail) or show clear evidence of mailing (for courier submissions) no later than 11:59 p.m. Pacific Daylight Time (PDT) on September 1, 2021.
- **Applications submitted by electronic mail:** Must be received no later than 11:59 p.m. Pacific Daylight Time (PDT) on September 1, 2021.

# Pre-Application Activities

- Ensure you have an active [SAM.gov](https://sam.gov) registration
  - May take up to 30 days to reactivate
  - An active registration is required to receive Federal funding
- Ensure you have access to Workspace in [Grants.gov](https://grants.gov)
  - You will submit your application through workspace on the grants.gov website
- Compile all of the grant application requirements as listed in the “*Content and Form of Applications*” section (pg. 14) of the NOFO

# How to Register to Apply through Grants.gov

*An excerpt from pg. 35 of the NOFO:*

Read the instructions below about registering to apply for the funds available under the Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program. Applicants should read the registration instructions carefully and prepare the information requested before beginning the registration process. Reviewing and assembling the required information before beginning the registration process will alleviate last-minute searches for required information.

Organizations must have a Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS) Number, active System for Award Management (SAM) registration, and Grants.gov account to apply for grants. If individual applicants are eligible to apply for this funding opportunity, then you may begin with step 3, Create a Grants.gov Account, listed below.

Creating a Grants.gov account can be completed online in minutes, but DUNS and SAM registrations may take several weeks. Therefore, an organization's registration should be done in sufficient time to ensure it does not impact the entity's ability to meet required application submission deadlines.

# Different Application Types

- There are three ways to apply for funds from the Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program:
  - Funding for a Broadband Use and Adoption Project **ONLY**
  - Funding for a Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Project **ONLY**
  - Funding for a Broadband Use and Adoption Project **AND** a Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Project
- All applications, regardless of project type, must submit the following with the application in Grants.gov:
  - ✓ SF-424
  - ✓ CD-511 Certification of Lobbying Form
  - ✓ Standard Form LLL

- Project outcomes, performance measures, outputs, evaluation plan, sustainability plan

# Required Forms and Documentation for Broadband Use and Adoption Projects ONLY

*An excerpt from pg. 17 of the NOFO:*

- ✓ **iv. Status as Eligible Entity.** Applicants should provide information to demonstrate that they are in the category of eligible entities as defined in section 905(a)(8) of the Act.
- ✓ **v. Budget Narrative and Detailed Budget Justification**

Applicants must submit a Detailed Budget Justification in the form of a spreadsheet, as well as a Budget Narrative in the form of a Word document. All budget information must support the dollar amounts identified in the SF-424 and SF-424A and demonstrate that the project or activity meets the eligible use requirements in the Act and in this NOFO.

The Detailed Budget Justification spreadsheet must reflect the cost categories that appear in the SF-424A and include itemized calculations for each cost placed under those categories. The spreadsheet must be formatted to fit letter-sized paper (8.5" x 11").

The Budget Narrative must explain the necessity and basis for all costs, clearly correspond to the information included in the Detailed Budget Justification spreadsheet, and reflect only allowable costs that are consistent with the project scope. Information on cost allowability is available in the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards at [2 C.F.R. § 200](#), which apply to awards in this program.



# **Required Forms and Documentation for Broadband Use and Adoption Projects ONLY (Cont.)**

*An excerpt from pg. 18 of the NOFO:*

## **vi. Indirect Cost Rate**

Section 905(c)(6) of the Act prohibits an eligible entity from using more than two percent (2%) of grants funds received under the Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program for administrative expenses. For this purpose, the two percent limitation on administrative expenses includes the combined total of indirect costs and direct administrative costs charged to an award.

- Broadband infrastructure deployment projects
  - includes support for the establishment of carrier-neutral submarine cable landing stations
  - may involve the construction of middle mile or last mile networks as well as interconnection.
- Applicants may propose projects that deploy new broadband infrastructure, replace antiquated infrastructure, or upgrade or extend existing infrastructure

## **✓ iii. Project Narrative for Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Projects**

The Project Narrative is a word-processed document of not more than 20 single- or 40 double-spaced pages responsive to the program description, statutory purposes, funding priorities, and the evaluation criteria set forth in this NOFO. The project narrative must identify specific tasks, measurable milestones and performance outcomes resulting for Native American/Alaska Native/Native Hawaiian communities from the proposed project activities. The Project Narrative shall include:

## **Project Narrative Components (Section D.2.c.iii on pgs. 19-21 of the NOFO)**

- Executive summary
- Description of eligible entity and qualifications and experience of key personnel
  - Table of Funded Project Participants and Unfunded Informal Collaborators
  - Resumes of Key Personnel
- Project objectives and activities
- Area to be served meeting Tribal lands definition and unserved households, businesses, or community anchor institutions
- Number of households in proposed service area at or below 150% poverty line
- Estimate of total number of jobs and workforce training plan

# **Required Forms and Documentation for Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Projects ONLY (Cont.)**

## **Project Narrative components (Section D.2.c.iii on pgs. 19-21 of the NOFO)**

- Description of how project will incorporate labor standards and workforce plans and practices
- Project plan with activities, timelines, and milestones
- Plan for long-term network sustainability
- Description of physical project area and its surroundings
  - Photographs, NEPA, NHPA, environmental and historic preservation documentation



# Required Forms and Documentation for Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Projects ONLY (Cont.)

*An excerpt from pgs. 21-22 of the NOFO:*

- ✓ **iv. Maps of Proposed Service Areas.** (preferably in shapefiles, kmz, kml formats).
- ✓ **v. Tribal Resolution** (preferred, but a Letter of Consent by the Governing Body of the Tribe will be accepted if the Tribal Council is not meeting due to COVID-19 closures or restrictions).
- ✓ **vi. Status as Eligible Entity.** Applicants should provide information to demonstrate that they are in the category of eligible entities as defined in this NOFO.
- ✓ **vii. Certification of Unserved Areas (optional).** A Tribal Government may certify whether an area within its own “Tribal Lands” is “unserved,” in lieu of using a non-tribal coverage/speed data set such as FCC 477 carrier sourced data. Any other Eligible Entity may also request a Tribal certification of “unserved.” Any such Tribal Government certification of “unserved” must certify that the areas where last mile service is proposed is unserved and provide a statement on Tribal Letterhead, and additional supporting information if available, explaining how that determination of unserved was made. The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands may also certify whether Tribal Lands as described in Subsection D of this NOFO are “unserved.” A Tribal Government may not certify Tribal Lands covered under an Enforceable Buildout Commitment, as defined in Section A.2.g of this NOFO, as unserved. A Tribal Government must disclose whether it has terminated an existing agreement qualifying as an Enforceable Buildout Commitment in anticipation of receiving funding under the Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program.

# Required Forms and Documentation for Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Projects ONLY (Cont.)

*An excerpt from pg. 22 of the NOFO:*

- ✓ **viii. Community Economic Development Strategy (optional).** An eligible entity may submit a copy of its or a regional or State Community Economic Development Strategy if applicable to its project proposal.
- ✓ **ix. Request for Extension of Award Period (optional).**
- ✓ **x. Budget Narrative and Detailed Budget Justification**

Applicants must submit a Detailed Budget Justification in the form of a spreadsheet, as well as a Budget Narrative in the form of a Word document. All budget information must support the dollar amounts identified in the SF-424 and SF-424C and demonstrate that the project or activity meets the eligible use requirements in the Act and in this NOFO.

The Detailed Budget Justification spreadsheet must reflect the cost categories that appear in the SF-424C and include itemized calculations for each cost placed under those categories. The spreadsheet must be formatted to fit letter-sized paper (8.5" x 11").

The Budget Narrative must explain the necessity and basis for all costs, clearly correspond to the information included in the Detailed Budget Justification spreadsheet, and reflect only allowable costs that are consistent with the project scope. Information on cost allowability is available in the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards at [2 C.F.R. § 200](#), which apply to awards in this program.

# **Required Forms and Documentation for Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Projects ONLY (Cont.)**

*An excerpt from pg. 22 of the NOFO:*

## **✓ xi. Indirect Cost Rate**

Section 905(c)(6) of the Act prohibits an eligible entity from using more than two percent (2%) of grants funds received under the Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program for administrative expenses. For this purpose, the two percent limitation on administrative expenses includes the combined total of indirect costs and direct administrative costs charged to an award.

# Optional Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Application Materials

*An excerpt from pg. 23 of the NOFO:*

## **d. Additional Application Materials**

Applicants may include the following documents in support of the application submission:

1. Pro forma financial information and analyses for the proposed project(s), such as balance sheets, income statements, and statement of cash flows; and
2. Network diagram and system design for broadband deployment and construction projects.
3. Tribal Government applicants that are interested in receiving funding from the Treasury's Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund, referenced in Section B.1 of this NOFO, should include the following short statement either in its project narrative or as a separate attachment giving permission for NTIA to share its complete application package with Treasury: "[Authorized Representative of Tribal Government] authorizes NTIA to provide its Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program application and supporting documents to Treasury for consideration in connection with an award from Treasury's Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund." Once NTIA receives this authorization, it will then transmit a copy of the application package to Treasury, which may use this information to assess more quickly the applicant's eligibility for funding under the Treasury program.

# Applying for Broadband Infrastructure Deployment Projects AND Broadband Use and Adoption Projects

# When Applying for Both Types of Projects...

- **Only submit one SF-424**
  - The estimated funding (field number 18) should show the funding request for both projects
- **TBCP has a 2% cap on Administrative and Indirect Costs**
  - This cap is on the total award amount and is not capped per project
  - Applicants should calculate the 2% off of the total funding requested (field number 18 on the SF-424 document)

# Submitting your Application

# Application Format Guidance

- **Font:** 10 point minimum
- **Line spacing:** single or double spacing
- **Margins:** one inch top, bottom, left, and right
- **Page layout:** Portrait orientation except for figures, graphs, images, and pictures. Paragraphs are to be clearly separated from each other
- **Page limit:** Project narrative is limited to 20 pages single spaced or 40 pages double spaced
  - *If you are applying for both infrastructure deployment and adoption and use: 20 single spaced or 40 pages double space for each, not total.*
- **Page size:** 8 ½ in x 11 in
- **Page numbering:** Number pages sequentially
