Economic Impact and Evaluation

DE Competitive Grant Evaluation Activities

The DE Competitive Grant NOFO contains certain evaluation components.

1. DE Competitive Grant evaluation is intended to help determine:

- ➤ Whether the grant's intended objectives were accomplished, including whether it achieved its intended outcomes.
- ➤ Whether the program resulted in measurable changes in participants from the Covered Populations, such as in knowledge or skills, including collecting data before, during, and after the program to understand potential changes.
- ➤ Whether the activity or intervention is making/has made progress toward the goals and objectives of the grant.
- ➤ How efficiently the program achieved its goals.

2. The evaluation strategy should include, at a minimum:

- ✓ Proposed data collection and analysis procedures, including frequency and scope.
- ✓ Key outcomes to be measured.
- ✓ A plan for continuous improvement to use evaluation findings to inform project activities, including obtaining input from beneficiaries and stakeholders to inform project adjustments.





DE Competitive Grant Evaluation Activities

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3. Competitive Grant funds must be used to support one or more of the following project activities:

- Develop and implement digital inclusion activities
- Facilitate the adoption of broadband
- Implement digital inclusion training programs
- Make equipment available for broadband services at low or no cost
- > Enhance public access through community anchor institutions
- ➤ Undertake any other activity considered to be consistent with Program purposes by the Assistant Secretary


4. Evaluation activities must explain how the activity facilitates one or more of the following outcomes:

- ✓ Economic stability, including workforce development and employment opportunities
- ✓ Access to quality education
- ✓ Access to healthcare
- ✓ Social and civic engagement
- ✓ Community access to the benefits of Internet technology






Digital Equity Act Population Viewer









Overview of DELN's Work in 2024 and What's Next





NTIA convenes three cohort groups: the State Broadband Leaders Network (SBLN), Digital Equity Leaders Network (DELN), and Tribal Broadband Leaders Network (TBLN) to provide support on NTIA's grant programs. The cohorts promote innovation and economic growth and are part of a concerted strategy to engage State/Territory, Tribal, and regional and local governments.

SBLN

A community of state and territory practitioners who work on increasing high-speed Internet deployment and access at the state level

DELN

A community of practitioners who work on increasing digital equity, digital inclusion, and access at the local, county, regional, and state government levels

TBLN

A community of practitioners who work on increasing broadband deployment and access on Tribal lands







NTIA Grant Programs Related to Cohorts

BEAD - \$42.45B

Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment Program

BEAD aims to expand high-speed Internet access by funding planning, infrastructure deployment and adoption programs in all 50 states, Washington D.C., Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

DE Act Programs - \$2.75B

Digital Equity Act Programs

The Digital Equity Act established three grant programs to promote digital opportunity and inclusion, providing funding for Digital Equity/Opportunity Plans and projects to promote broadband adoption, use, and skills:

- State Digital Equity Planning Grant Program (\$60M);
- State Digital Equity Capacity Grant Program (\$1.44B; \$45.3M of which is for Native Entities); and
- Competitive Grant Program (\$1.25B).

TBCP I and II - \$3B

Tribal Broadband
Connectivity Program

Under the first Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) authorized by the Consolidated Appropriations Act 2021 (CAA), TBCP I awarded grants to Tribes and Tribal broadband deployment on Tribal lands, as well as for telehealth, distance learning, broadband affordability, and digital inclusion. Under the second NOFO authorized by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), TBCP II will award additional funding for Tribal broadband infrastructure, adoption, and use projects.









What does DELN do?

DELN serves as a space for trainings, conversations, and technical assistance on the **Digital Equity Act** which provides \$2.75 billion to establish three grant programs that promote digital equity and inclusion.

Who is eligible to participate in DELN?

Participants are usually part of a dedicated digital equity office or programs in their local, regional, or state government or have identified digital equity and broadband as a specific responsibility within their agency or department. The positions may reside in the mayor or county executive offices, offices of technology and innovation, economic development, public library or local education offices, public utility/public service commission, newly formed digital equity offices, or state or territorial broadband offices.

• **283** participants representing all 72 local governments, 4 regional governments, 1 Tribal government, and 52 states and territories make up DELN

1 In-Person Meeting

- Joint Cohort Summit, September 17-19, Portland, OR
 - Attendance: 79 DELN members in attendance from states/territories and 113 local governments; 76 in-person and 3 virtual
 - Topics: Innovative approaches to digital equity, data-driven investments, developing outcomefocused digital equity programs, building effective partnerships, approaches for larger and small/rural communities, approaches to hard-to-reach populations, sustainability/capacity of digital equity programs, opportunities/collaborations with Federal agencies, and community outreach and engagement

Digital Equity Program Highlights



- ✓ Awarded DE Planning Grants to 56 states and territories totaling more than \$53.7 million.
- ✓ Received applications for more than \$644 million in DE Capacity Grants to 52 states and territories and are in the process of announcing them.
- ✓ The DE Native Entity Capacity and Planning Grant Program opened in September 2024. \$45.3 million has been set aside for Native Entities on a competitive basis; the application period will close in February 2025.
- ✓ The DE Competitive Grant Program opened in July 2024. Applications were due by September 23, 2024, for Eligible Entities, and by October 22, 2024, for U.S. Territories. NTIA received more than 700 applications totaling over \$6.5 billion. NTIA expects to begin awarding funds this coming Winter.
- ✓ To support the opening of the DE Capacity, Native Entity DE Capacity and Planning, and DE Competitive Grant Programs, NTIA conducted 28 application and guidance webinars for eligible applicants.
- NTIA produced 45+ public facing technical assistance materials and held 80+ one-on-one technical assistance sessions for to support Eligible Entities in producing high-quality applications and proposals.



New Resources and Continued Engagement with Digital Equity Stakeholders





- Developing State Digital Equity Plans
- **Making subgrants** to other entities, such as community anchor institutions, municipalities, Indian Tribes, nonprofits, and other organizations, that help develop the Digital Equity Plan
- State Planning and Capacity funds were allocated **proportionally** based on the State's population, share of members of covered populations, and relative lack of availability and adoption among residents.





Programs funds can be used for different purposes.

Uses of State Capacity and Competitive Grant funds:

- Updating and implementing State Digital Equity Plans (Capacity)
- Pursuing digital inclusion activities
- Facilitating adoption of high-speed Internet
- Implementing training and workforce development programs
- Making equipment and software for high-speed Internet services available
- Constructing or upgrading public access computer centers
