Additionally, broadband service assistance provides Tribal citizens with \$2,000 towards their broadband internet bills, as well as assistance and education on setting up/purchasing services, equipment, etc.

	Funds for this project were largely expended for the purcahse of broadband devices (laptops) and bill pay assistance. As well, funds were expended for a part-time staff (PTE)
